

Power Cube Cover Instructions

Note: These at-home instructions help you produce covers similar, but not identical, to the official covers

Components and equipment for 2 covers

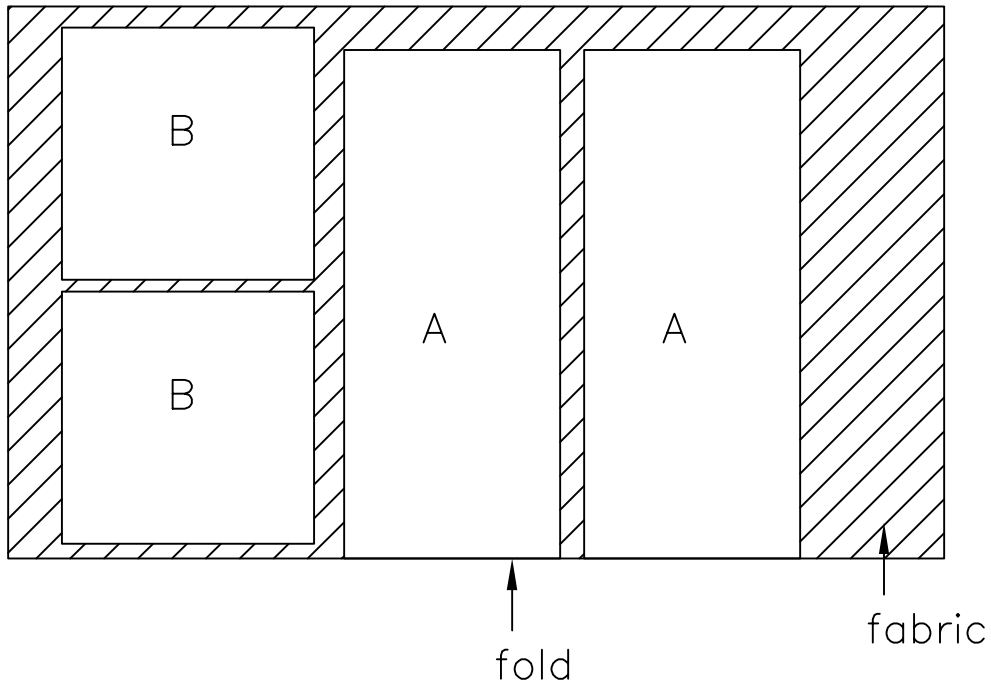
- 1½ yards of Nylon fabric that is 60" wide
 - The official covers use 600 Denier fabric
- 4 all-purpose zippers 22" long (2 zippers per cover)
 - You could use one longer zipper, but shorter zippers are typically lighter weight and easier to sew
- Thread
- Pins
- Pinking shears (scissors that have a zigzag cut)
- Pencil
- Yardstick
- Sewing machine that can zigzag stitch
- Zipper foot for sewing machine

Directions

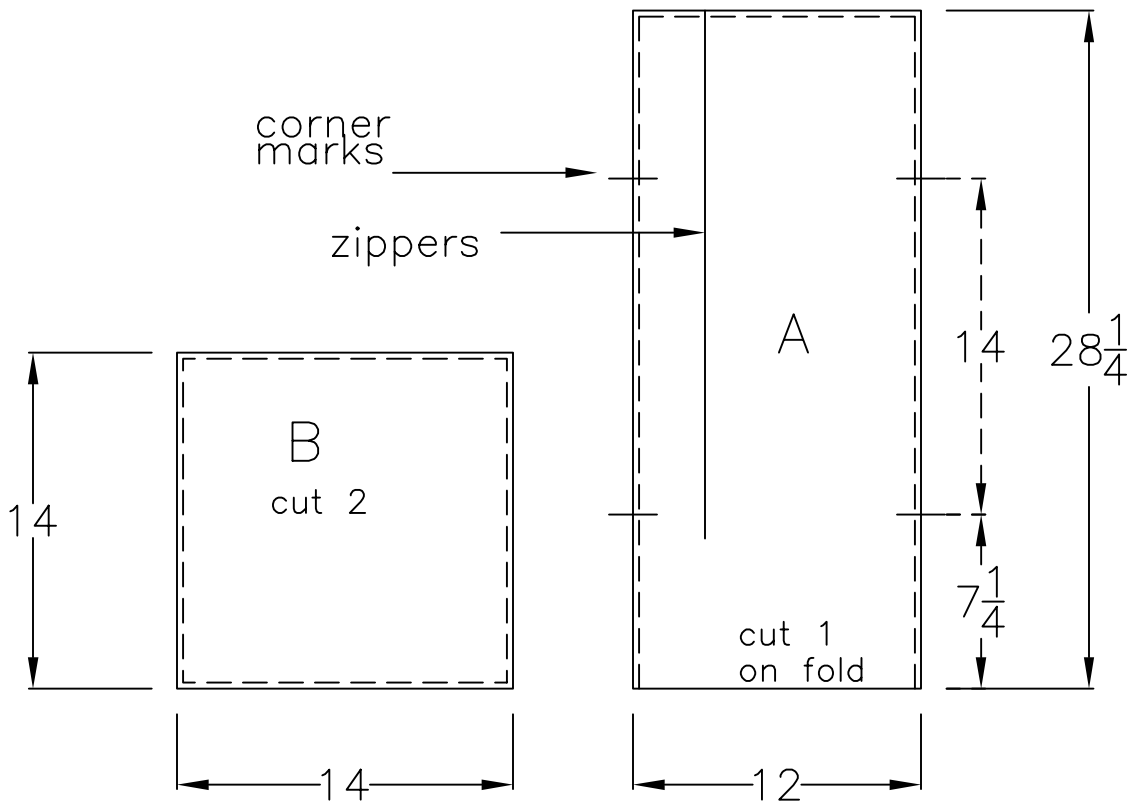
1. Fold fabric in half such that it's 30" x 42".
2. Using the pencil and yardstick, draw the pattern onto the fabric following the layout provided (note, it's for 2 covers).
3. Put the corner marks on the fabric.
4. Cut out the pieces using the pinking shears so that the fabric does not fray. Cuts should be made so the zigzag pattern the shears make is on the outside of the lines you have drawn. In other words, the cuts do not cross the lines.
5. Unfold piece A and layout zippers so that the top tabs overlap each other in the middle and the zipper pulls are as close to each other as possible. Pin in place. Zippers should be face down on the backside of the fabric.
6. Using a zipper foot, stitch down both sides of the zippers and across the ends. Stitch back and forth at the ends to secure.
7. Go over your stitches with a close zigzag stitch to help prevent fraying.
8. Turn fabric to right side and cut along the zipper in between the stitches to expose the zippers. Cut any fraying pieces near the stitches.
9. Fold piece A back in half, right sides together (fronts of zippers will be inside) and stitch the 12" sides together using a ¼" seam.
10. Pin right sides together, one piece B to the top of piece A (the side that is closest to the zipper). Matching corners of B to the corner marks on A and sew together using a ¼" seam.
11. Unzip the top enough to get your hand through. This is to help with turning the cover right side out when finished.
12. Pin right sides together the other piece B to the bottom of piece A and sew a ¼" seam.
13. Turn right side out. Unzip completely to insert your milk crate.
